Beverley Ball


Manawatu

Zoom provides a welcome distraction



Meet Zoom! He's been part of the Auckland City Hospital CVICU team now for many years. His mum Lisa says: "We have had so many amazing experiences – one that stands out is when we were visiting regularly with a long term patient in the ICU (a young woman) who loved her weekly visits. During this time, we found out that she shared a birthday with Zoom and was in fact turning 21 ... we were able to visit on her birthday and she was then able to take Zoom for a walk (I think her first time up and out of bed!)

Another moment that sticks with me was a young mum whose husband had been given a very short time to live – she was devastated and desperately wanted a visit from Zoom – once in the room she broke down and just hugged Zoom on the floor for ten minutes. It was one of the most poignant, sad and emotional times of my life – but the comfort that Zoom was able to give her was something that will always stay with me.

Sometimes people just want to pat him and chat about their animals and be able to have some time where the focus isn't just on their medical situation. He provides a very welcome distraction.

Moxey brings joy to clients and staff

Eamon O'Donnell is a registered nurse working in community mental health for Te Toka Tumai.
